<p>used by the teacher to set up the activity</p>	<p>needed by the students to complete the activity</p>	<p>Sentence Patter / Vocabulary</p>
<p>*Ask high level Ss to model the game rules *not just ask Ss 'Do you understand' but ask Ss to say something out.</p>	<p>*teach Ss before the task/activity *Make your own classroom functional language card *allow Ss to speak Chinese at the beginning, then no point with Chinese, double the point with all English</p>	<p>Sometimes the target language is the least part.</p>

- ⦿ Take turns to come up to the stage.
- ⦿ Chant the chant with your group.

## Functional Language

- ⦿ Let's try (do) ....
- ⦿ Hands. Feet. (Body parts)
- ⦿ Jump. Clap. (Actions)
- ⦿ Faster.
- ⦿ Louder.
